

# Ferrari Club of America Mid-Atlantic Region

## Additional Track Event Notes

Here are some additional “bullet points” for our members to review to avoid track day issues and to be prepared for the event.

- All cars participating in **any** run group (includes green, white, blue, or red) must have been tech inspected and passed by a legitimate facility.
- Participating cars must pass all conditions indicated on the tech inspection form as indicated by a check mark and or comments indicating that each item has been checked, by an authorized representative of the inspection organization and that the form has been both signed with the inspector’s name clearly printed, dated, and with the inspection organization clearly indicated.
- Only the current official Ferrari Club of America Tech Inspection Form may be used.
- Any cars that arrive with questionable tech inspection forms will either be tech inspected again by an authorized service representative (if available at the track location) or may not be allowed on the track.
- Many track events are a wet or dry event. If you have a street car be sure that your tires (especially track tires) have sufficient tread depth for wet conditions. Many race tracks tend to puddle and drain slow in spots.
- All run groups require the driver and any passenger to wear a Snell SA 2000 or newer helmet. No motorcycle or Snell MA rated helmets are allowed.
- Green and White run groups require a minimum of long sleeved shirt and long pants (all cotton) with full coverage leather shoes preferable. (No sandals please!)
- Blue and Red run groups require minimum two layer suit (or nomex long underwear and single layer suit). Don’t forget fire resistant shoes, socks and gloves. A Balaclava (head sock) is also recommended. Note that a Balaclava (head sock) is required in these run groups if you have any facial hair.
- Many race tracks prohibit any person in the pit area with short pants or significant areas of unprotected skin. Observers and non-drivers be forewarned as well.
